ESPRESSIONE DELLA SETTIMANA - 12 APRILE 2022

❖ *Ti auguro ogni bene.* ❖

❖ I wish you well. ❖ ❖ ❖ I wish you the best. ❖

❖ *Ti auguro ogni bene.* → ‘*ti*’ is an **indirect object pronoun** meaning either the *singular* ‘you’ or ‘to you’ when addressing someone in **INFORMAL** situations.

❖ In **FORMAL** situations, use ‘*Le*’ → *Le auguro ogni bene.*

❖ The complete set of indirect object pronouns (two “types”):

“UNSTRESSED”: *MI, TI, GLI / LE / LE, CI, VI, LORO*

“STRESSED”: *A ME, A TE, A LUI / A LEI / A LEI, A NOI, A VOI, A LORO*

❖ *Vi auguro ogni bene.* → ‘*vi*’ is an **indirect object pronoun** meaning either the *plural* ‘you’ or ‘to you’ when addressing more than one person in **both** **FORMAL** and **INFORMAL** situations.

❖ *Mi auguro ogni bene.* → ‘*mi*’ is an **indirect object pronoun** meaning ‘me’ when addressing oneself. This is just an illustration; obviously, rational people would not say, “I wish myself well.”

❖ In “*Ti auguro ogni bene.*” this is the **first-person, present** conjugation of the verb **AUGURARE**. The subject pronoun ‘*io*’ is implied. It *can* be used, but is optional

→ *(Io) Ti auguro ogni bene.*

❖ **OGNI** → “every” or “each”

❖ **BENE** → used here as a noun meaning “good (thing)”, “advantage” or “well-being”

❖ The expression “*Ti auguro ogni bene.*” can also be said this way:

→ *Auguro ogni bene A TE / A VOI / A LUI*, etc.

❖ Some other examples → *Auguro ogni bene a te e famiglia / a voi e famiglie / a te e tua moglie / a te e Peppinello.* etc.

❖ When you want to say “WE wish you well.” → *Ti / Le / Vi AUGURIAMO ogni bene.* or the form → *AUGURIAMO ogni bene a te / a voi.*

❖ By the way, there is also a literal translation for “I wish you the best.”

→ *Ti auguro il meglio.*

❖ Finally, the NOUN (*il/un*) **AUGURIO** means “a (good) wish” – in the plural → (*gli*) **AUGURI**

→ *Ti mando il mio augurio più caro per il tuo compleanno.*

→ *Vi mandiamo tantissimi auguri Buon Anniversario!*
